



Richard E. Gray, Dist. M, ASCE, and Hon. D., GE, received a 2010 Carnegie Mellon University, Alumni Achievement Award for this accomplishments and devotion to the practice of geotechnics, geotechnical engineering and engineering geology.

Richard Gray's exceptional work has made him one of the world's foremost experts in land subsidence caused by mining operations, disposal of expansive shale and slag, and mine reclamation.

A registered geologist in 14 states, he has worked extensively throughout the country, in addition to consulting on mine subsidence in Alberta, Vancouver Island, and in New Zealand; on steel-mill foundations in Iran; and on mine fires in India.

Over the years, Mr. Gray has held a chairmanship or presidency in all three of the United States' engineering geology organizations, and has selflessly given his time to the benefit of local, state, and national levels of such organizations as the American Society of Civil Engineers.

For his longstanding service, Mr. Gray received the Award of Merit from the American Society for Testing and Materials, among a host of other high honors.

Mr. Gray co-founded DiGioia Gray & Associates in 2005 and continues to contribute to the field, and helps to educate the next generation of engineering geologists.
